



# Book Club



#### I"LL HAVE THE VEAL AND THE CAR WILL HAVE......

The grin is automatic when I open the garage door to the Corvette, its curves muted by the cover. The cover off, it sits in the shadows of the garage, quietly waiting. Waiting for me, and I can't resist caressing it, running my fingertips over the subtle upswept curves of the rear quarter panel. Circling the taillights, and following the beltline to the front. Tender polishing has enhanced the sensation; feels so smooth, almost soft.

The car welcomes me with a polite little horn when I reach for the door handle. Easing into the cool leather glove of the seat, the car holds me; it is allowing me to drive. A flick of the key and we have ignition! I listen for any foreign noises, but it just ticks over at a slight cam idle. I can see it waiting with a Madonna smile.

I back out of the garage and scan the engine gauges. Oil pressure is acceptable; everything else is cold, still waking up; especially the tires when I turn onto the street. The ride is hard, but softens after a few miles as the Goodyear's heat up. I am attached to the road, not isolated by layers of insulation, and Lazy Boy suspension. I become the car and the car becomes me.

The morning sun at the Cascade horizon, sends out beams of its rising. The sky is clear and I'm out for a drive in a roadster, even though the majority of the miles are 4 lane freeway. Top down! I reach up and touch the air rising up over the windshield; a little cool. But I'm warm and snug sitting IN a car between the frame rails, watching the road come to me. The car wants to run, I want to run. I want to feel the world, the road. the air, the sun and hear the drumbeat of exhaust. The car is faster and almost quicker than any motorcycle I have ever owned, enhancing the same sensations of being totally alive, aware, not to mention warmer and less prone to become a statistic.

At the on-ramp, the car says, "Now!" A steady pressure on the gas pedal, staying just out of range of the computerized traction control and the car still responds with a headlong rush. Each shift of the transmission sends me to another level. Wind noise increases, and I am pressed back against the seat. Only halfway down the ramp I am exceeding the speed limit by 40 miles an hour and I have to break to enter the freeway. I can't suppress the urge to laugh and I want to hug the car. I would treat it to dinner and give it roses if I could. but my wife wouldn't understand. (Maybe she would, she drove a 68 Camaro before we were married).

In an everyday-mobile, a normal "point A to point B" machine; 4 doors and coffee holders; radio tuned to the traffic channel, I tend to go with traffic, to blend in, exceeding the speed limit by 5 or 10 miles an hour, like everyone else. But a feeling of well-being has been created and there is no need to accessorize. Blending in is not possible in a red Corvette roadster and I have the power to slow my world down. In the slow-lane, I can watch the rest of the world rushing by with the knowledge that 2 inches below my right foot lays another World. A World that's not attainable for those other cars.

A small boy in his rear car seat in a Volvo station-wagon stares at the car with a smile on his face as long as

he can see us. A flat black Honda with an absurd rear spoiler, snarling exhaust, and a scowling front air dam, comes along side and wants to race. But I don't have to. I don't need to prove a thing; I'm driving a Corvette.

The car has created a public place that is a private space for me. I am the car, the car is me.


