Billy Chambers asked when the newsletter would be available on the website. President Tony stated that we would start it in May. That would give enough time at the next meetings for people to sign up.





Proposed Amendment to the CGCC By-laws

The following proposed amendment will bring the CGCC By-Laws in line with the way the club has been functioning over the past few years. It will delete and change some of the current duties of the Newsletter/Vital Statistic Chairperson and create a new Club Roster Committee Chair. Current wording on the proposed sections for change: ARTICLE IV - DUTIES

Section VIII: Newsletter/Vital Statistic (amended 1/93)

- A. The official CGCC newsletter shall be called "Under Glass"
- B. The chairperson shall be the official mailing address.
- C. "Under Glass" will be the monthly notification of the regular business or any other meetings.
- D. It shall contain all notices of club events, NWACC functions, or any other in formation, or articles the committee receives before the newsletter deadline, and believes to be in the best interest of the club.
- E. Provide a monthly newsletter article listing additions or interim changes to the roster, member's birthdays and club anniversaries, any proposed or accepted changes to the Articles of Incorporation or By-laws
- F. Prospective member's names shall appear in the newsletter following each meeting attended
- G.The chairpersons, or appointed committee member, shall be responsible for maintaining a current mailing list, permanent list of member's birthdays, permanent record of anniversary dates when members joined CGCC, maintain a total count of CGCC members, and provide mailing labels for the newsletter and other club mailings.
- H. This committee shall work closely with the Membership Committee, Treasurer, and Secretary.
- I. Print, publish, and distribute a roster to all members of the club two times a year (unless no changes). This roster shall list names, addresses and phone numbers of members. Preferred method of distribution is utilizing the newsletter.
- J. Never release the roster to anyone outside the club without the permission of the Executive Board.
- K. For security reasons, never indicate on the roster anything which would associate it with the club or Corvettes
- L. Maintain the master copy of the Articles of Incorporation and By-laws and type and distribute revisions when enacted. Preferred method of distribution is utilizing the newsletter.

Proposed changes and additions to ARTICLE IV -

DUTIES to read as follows:


Section VIII: Newsletter

- A. Remains the same. Delete descriptions B, I, J & K.
- B. Previous Description C

- C. Previous Description D
- D. Provide a monthly newsletter article listing any proposed or accepted changes to the Articles of Incorporation or By-Laws.
- E. Prospective member's names shall appear in the newsletter following each meeting attended.
- F. The chairperson, or appointed committee member, shall be responsible for providing mailing labels for the newsletter and other club mailings.
- G. Previous Description H
- H. Previous Description L
- I. The chairperson shall be an Executive Board member.

Section XIX: Club Roster

- A. The chairperson shall maintain a CGCC Membership Roster. Database will include all member's Name & Address, Phones (home & cell) & E-mails, Birthdays, Anniversary Date of joining CGCC, Corvette(s) and CB Handle.
- B. Shall have all new members fill out a form providing their roster data as soon as possible after becoming members.
- C. Will accept new and updated roster data from any current member.
- D. New member roster data and new or updated current member data will be incorporated into the membership roster and e-mailed to all members providing an e-mail address on a monthly basis. Paper copies of the membership roster will be brought to the monthly meetings for any members who do not have e-mail addresses.
- E. Work closely with Membership Committee, Treasurer, and Secretary.
- F. To collate and supply lists (birthday, addresses, email addresses, etc) to any committee chairperson as requested
- G. Never release the roster to anyone outside the club without the permission of the Executive Board.
- H. The chairperson shall be an Executive Board member.




