GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING
SATURDAY, OCTOBER 8, 2005

President Tony Hyatt called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Lakewood Elks. *Tony* asked if Tim Donlin was present as he had won a windbreaker from the CGCC club raffle last month. He was not present.

Vice President Marty Morin appointed Stephanie Cavender as sergeant of arms.

Jeanine Korn read the Treasurer's report.

The September minutes were approved as printed in the October Underglass.

Bob DePirro reported on past events. Don Rollins led the Oregon covered bridge tour. He reported that there were 7 cars including 2 guests. Four of the cars were yellow. They visited 9 bridges. Gary Pautz reported on the tour of Griot's Garage on October 1. They showed how to use their products on our own cars – hands on experience. Ron Waller reported on the NWACC autocross held October 2 at the Shelton Airport. There were 38 cars. More events are planned for the Shelton Airport next year. Bob continued with the upcoming events including: October 15-16 – Leavenworth tour with a wine tasting at 6:00 on Saturday; October 16 – Book Club meeting at Borders; November 16 – Jacket night at Towers for miniature golf; December 3 – Hot Toddy Run in Gig Harbor; December 10 – Christmas Banquet; and December 14 – Joe and Stephanie Cavender's Christmas display.

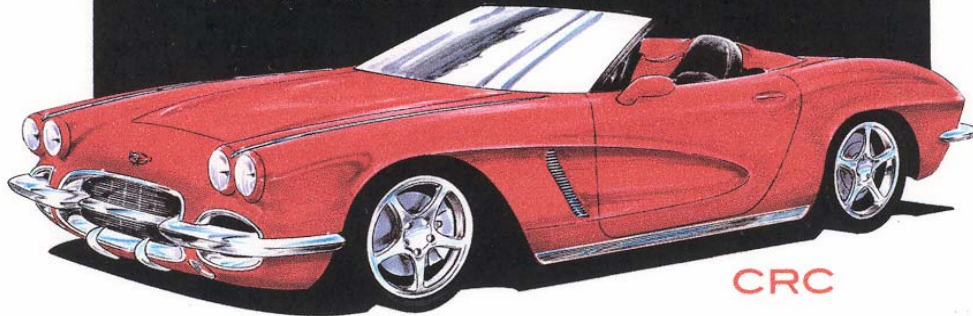

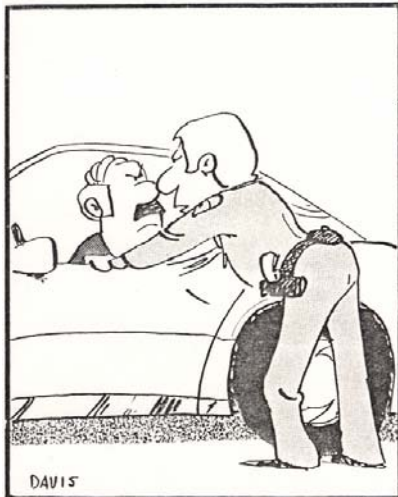

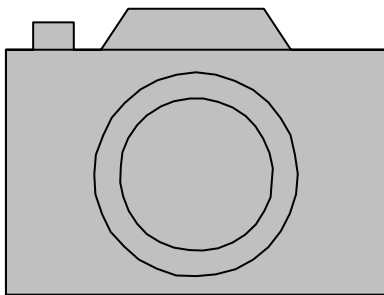

As I announced at our September meeting, Elvira and I spent the Labor Day weekend at the Museum. During the LD celebration, the Museum drew the winning ticket for the 2006 Red Coupe (\$10 raffle). The winner is Tim Brickel of Leesport, PA. The Museum also had the drawing for a 2006 Velocity Yellow Convertible (\$100 tickets). The winner of that Corvette was Lynette McLain of Oklahoma City, OK. 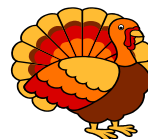

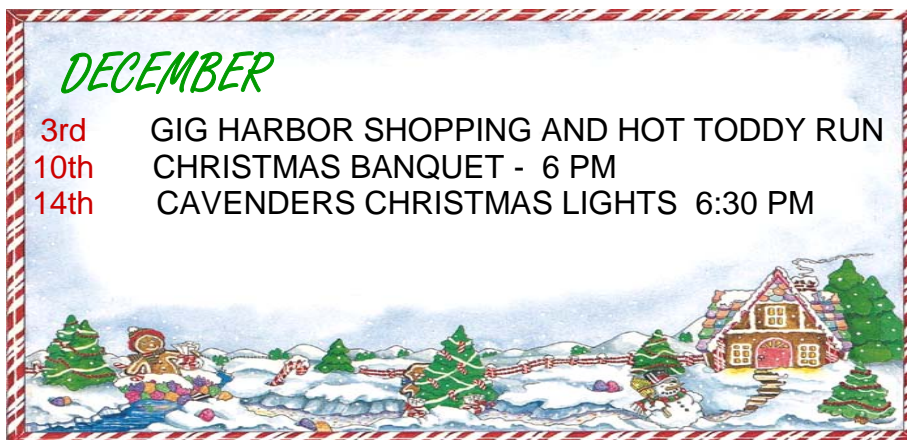
