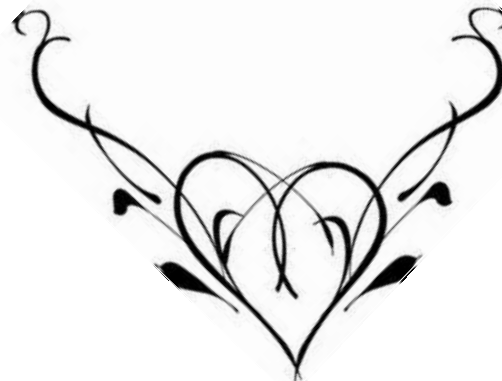

Motorsports Park Named Outstanding Facility of the Year

The Race Track Business Conference has awarded the NCM Motorsports Park the "Outstanding Facility of the Year" award. The plaque was presented by National Speedway Directory and Track Guide at the Performance Racing Industry Trade Show.



"The NCM Motorsports Park is the next generation venue that meets the needs of automotive manufacturers and after-market performance entities. Having a facility that is close to the Corvette assembly plant provides a unique opportunity for performance research and development." said Tim Frost the organizer of the event.

2015 BASH

Now there are **three** excellent reasons to drive to the "Bash" this year. The first is the Bash itself. I enjoy the Bash as much or more than the Anniversary Celebration, the other major event each year. The Bash is the event where Corvette brings new and future Corvette releases along with the engineers to tell you about the new features. The Bash is the last week-end in April (23-25).



In conjunction with the Bash, the Museum will have an High Performance Driving Event (HPDE) event at the NCM Motorsports Park April 23-24, 2015. This event will have four student run groups: beginners, low intermediate, high intermediate and advanced. There will also be an instructor group. Classroom sessions will take place for HPDE.



And to cap it all off, after the Bash, you can do the **Tail of the Dragon Run Tour**. Spring in the Smokie Mountains, Tail of the Dragon and the Biltmore Estate are all combined into one great Museum in Motion tour. The Museum trip will depart from Bowling Green on Sunday, April 26, heading East to run the famous TN-129 (aka Tail of the Dragon). The tour arrives in Asheville, NC for a stay at the Biltmore Inn, located on the Biltmore Estate grounds.

Engine Build Program Offered for Z06

Starting March 2015, Corvette Z06 customers will be able to assemble the 650-hp supercharged LT4 engine for their cars at the new Performance Build Center inside the Bowling Green Assembly Plant.

The Engine Build Experience is selected with order code PBC and is offered on all Z06 trim levels. The \$5,000 package includes a full day with a Performance Build Center engine assembly technician who instructs and oversees the build, a personalized engine plaque identifying the owner/builder and the date of the engine build, and professional photography of the experience.

The National Corvette Museum handles the concierge services for the customer, following up on the scheduled build date and handling logistics on the day of the build. Travel and lodging costs are the responsibility of the customer.

Sinkhole is Filled, Other Work Continues

With the exception of a small area surrounding the HVAC duct, the filling of the sinkhole is complete. The SMD team used "manufactured sand" (a crushed limestone) to fill the hole, and with the aid of two remote controlled Bobcats, the sand was spread and compacted throughout the process. It took 10 days to fill it. This week, the team has been working to remove the remaining existing concrete slab floor in the Skydome.
