

There was no 1983 Corvette.




For the C4 Generation of Corvettes, GM was a little too ambitious, using a lot of new and unproven technologies. The C4 ended up being delayed for a year, and production of the C3 wasn't extended. As a result, no 1983 Corvettes were ever sold, even though a few prototypes are floating around out there.

The magnetic-ride suspension reacts separately to each inch of road at 60 mph.

In 2003 GM's magnetorheological suspension debuted on the Corvette, and it has since spread all the way up to the likes of Ferrari. It reacts so quickly (1,000 times per second) that at 60 mph it's adapting to each inch of road separately.

One advantage about writing an article for the Under Glass is that you can write about anything Corvette related you would like. On my recent family related trip to Southern California, Elvira and I decided to drive the Corvette and do some vacation type activities in Northern California on the return trip.



Even though we grew up in California, neither of us had ever done any wine tasting in the Napa/Sonoma area. We met Gary and Candy in the Napa area and spent a day in the Napa Valley at several of the

wineries. For highlights of the wine tasting you'll need to talk with Elvira or Candy. But we all enjoyed the Castle tour.

The highlight of the trip for me was driving the north section of CA Highway 1 from just north of San Francisco to just south of Eureka. I have driven all of CA-1 and US 101 south of San Francisco, but this was my first time on this stretch of the Highway. I'm not sure of the statistics of the first section of the highway, but it has to come close to the number of turns per mile on the Tail of the Dragon, US-129. It takes all day, but it's a day of almost continuous curves through mountains, forests, farmlands, and along the coast. We were fortunate to have light traffic for the drive and we passed everyone (eventually) that got in front of us. Most of the drivers were courteous and pulled over at the first opportunity. We had an unobstructed drive most of the day. If you have the opportunity, I recommend the drive.

A Surprising Discovery on the One Millionth Corvette

Craftspeople and technicians at the GM Design Center are painstakingly restoring the historic 1 millionth Chevrolet Corvette, damaged February, 2014 when a sinkhole opened up in the Museum.

The restoration crew is part of GM's Mechanical Assembly group, which typically spends its time building prototype and concept vehicles. The white 1992 Corvette is a challenge because rather than build an all-new vehicle from the ground up, the workers are trying to preserve the original appearance of a production vehicle.

"We got it back here and we started opening it up, and one of the cool things, we saw were all the signatures of the employees, they had signed individual parts as the vehicle was being built, and that's throughout the whole vehicle, inside of the fascias, the frame," said Ed Welburn, Vice President of Global Design. "You can kinda envision them doing that, because they didn't sign a complete vehicle, they signed it as it was being built.

NCM Motorsports Park Debuts Start Stand

The NCM Motorsports Park can cross "start stand" off its wish list of track amenities as Corvette enthusiast Don Ghareeb recently came forward to fund the project.

Don is no stranger to the Park, backing it from the beginning by purchasing five acres through the "buy an acre" program to help the Museum acquire land for the track. "The race track is so cool, they have a good guy to run it, and it's booked with lots of events. I wanted to help," Don said.

After taking delivery of his Z06/Z07 in January, Don took to the track for a few laps. "I was talking to Mitch about how things were coming along at the track. Holley had just stepped up to support the Control Tower and he mentioned the start stand was next on the wish list. I thought I'd help," said Don.



The start stand is 14 feet high, featuring a six foot by 12 foot deck. "We're very fortunate to have enthusiasts like Don who see a need, and without hesitation step up to help fulfill that need," said Mitch Wright, General Manager.

Pavilion / Garages Opening Soon

Construction on the Kimberlee A. Fast Pavilion and garages will be complete soon, offering covered, open air picnic seating, showers, and restrooms with flushing toilets. The garages will be available for day rentals, and have a 2nd level viewing platform to provide better visibility of the track. There will be access to the restrooms by the end of the month.


